 - Local planning department staff

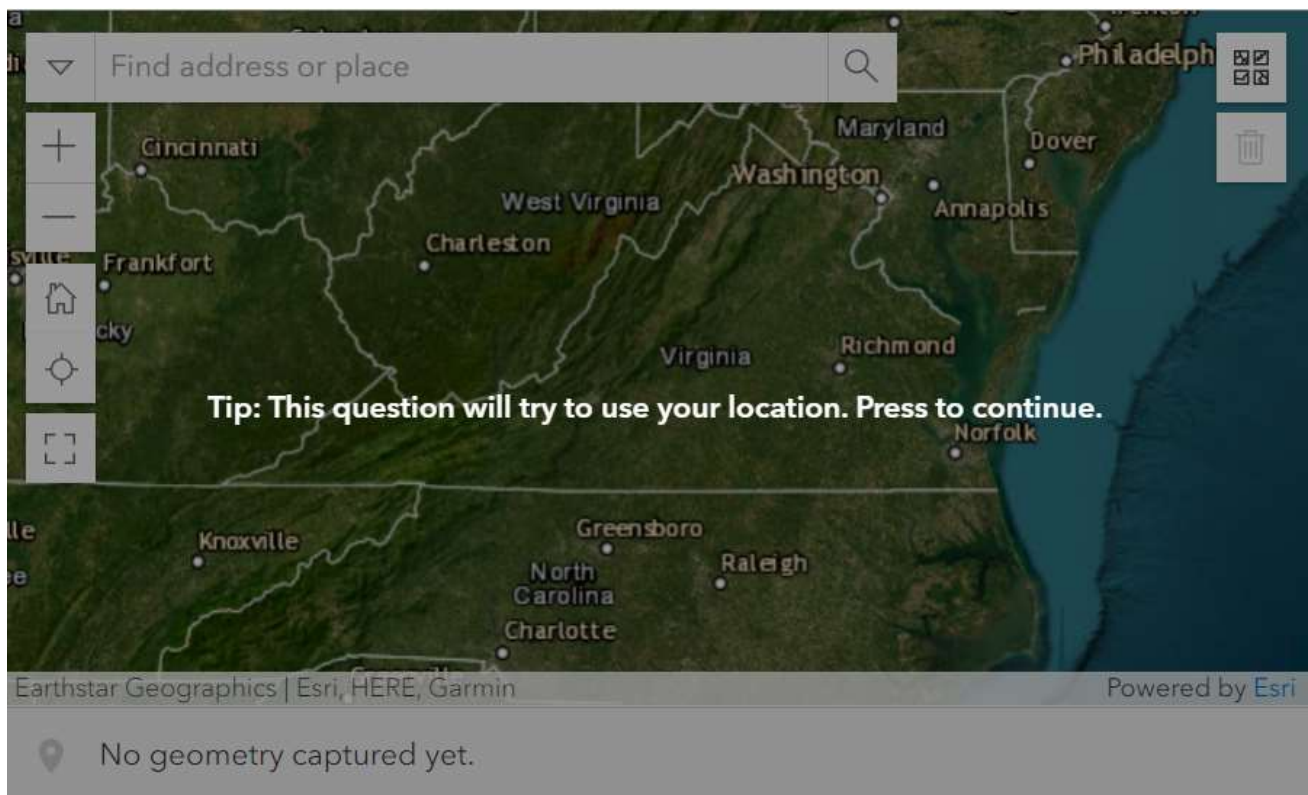


